





NC Elections Update

Following the November 3 elections, it appears the political dynamics in North Carolina will stay the same with the governor and legislative leadership representing different parties. Democratic Governor Roy Cooper was re-elected, while Republicans held onto majorities in both the NC House (65 Republicans/ 51 Democrats) and NC Senate (28 Republicans/22 Democrats). Leadership in those chambers is also on target to remain the same. On Monday, Rep. Tim Moore was elected to his fourth term as Speaker of the House, tying the record for longest serving Speaker, which was set by Liston Ramsey in the 1980's. Senator Phil Berger is also expected to remain Senate President Pro Tem. The next session of the General Assembly will convene January 13, 2021.

The NCACCT encourages trustees to work with your presidents and fellow board members and reach out to <u>your elected officials</u> now to congratulate them on their election wins, and begin to build relationships with new legislators.

Board Chairs Training Session

On Thursday, November 5, the NCACCT hosted a virtual Zoom training session specifically for Board Chairs. Led by Julie Woodson, NCACCT President/CEO, the meeting included discussion of best practices for leading the board, the importance of legislative advocacy, and hearing tips directly from long-time Board Chairs. 37 of the college chairs were able to participate in this event. Until we can gather together in person, we look forward to holding another targeted virtual training session soon.
